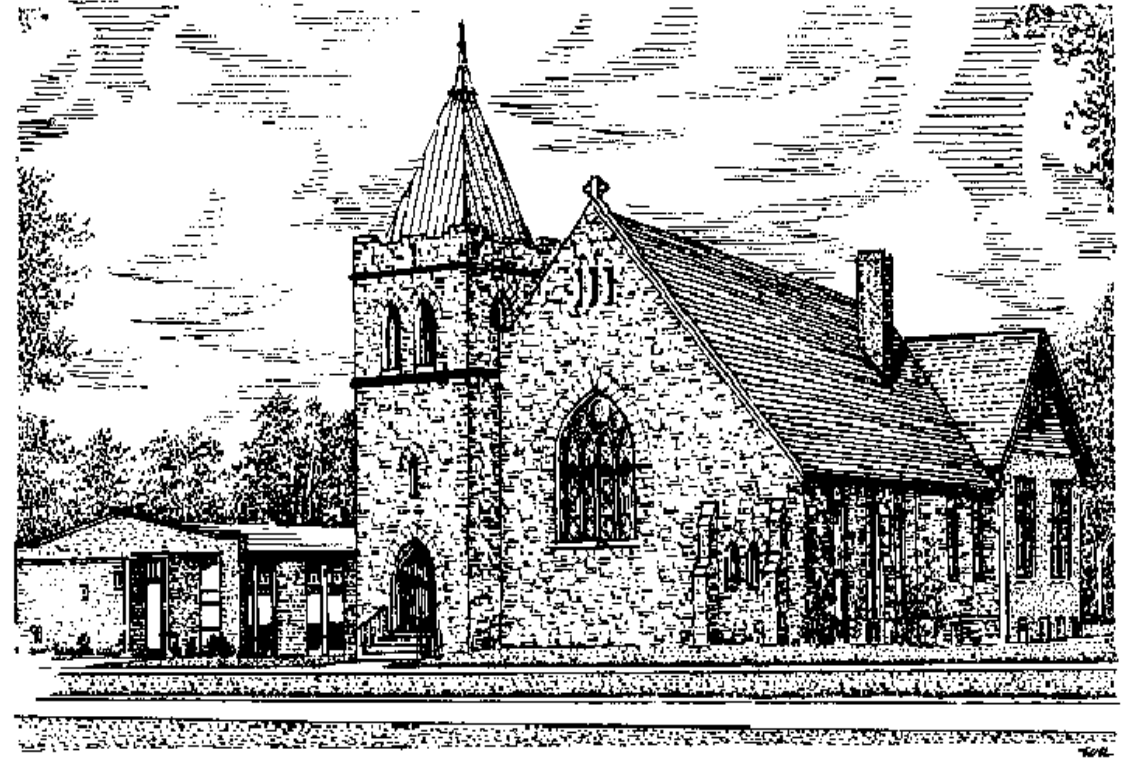

Dear Mary Taylor Memorial Church community,

Today’s message takes its title, “This is it!” from a note by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., hand-written in a biography on the life of Mahatma Gandhi. Dr. King’s personal copy of Gandhi’s biography is on display today in the The Martin Luther King Jr. Center for Non-Violent Social Change in Atlanta (www.thekingcenter.org). What “this” is, and its connection to Methodism, is a part of my message.

The Beatitudes, today’s Gospel, remind us that the teaching of Jesus is always counter-cultural. While some of these sayings “make sense” as human wisdom regards such things, many of them don’t. It could be said of these sayings, as Paul says of the Cross in First Corinthians, that they are foolish. These sayings - that blessings come to those who are poor in spirit, who mourn, who are meek, who are hungry and thirsty for righteousness and who are persecuted and reviled – are not the greatest marketing tag lines.

Nor are they intended to be. They are intended to be the teaching of the One who calls us to be witnesses for God as “the salt of the earth” and “the light of the world.” Ah, but that’s next week’s message! For today, it is enough to remember, with the prophet Micah, that we are called to “do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God.”
