

Dear Mary Taylor Memorial family,

Rembrandt's 1766 painting "Return of the Prodigal Son" and Fr. Henri Nouwen's book <u>The Return of the Prodigal Son</u> are the basis for my message today of the same title. While it is a story about coming home and forgiveness, it is most of all about the unstoppable love of God. The small reproduction of Rembrandt's work in today's bulletin is my gift to the congregation. I hope the visual will carry the message in a helpful way.

"Laetare," the fourth Sunday in Lent, is the mid-point of our journey to Easter. It takes its name from the traditional Latin introit of the day "Rejoice ye with Jerusalem" (Isaiah 66:10). A reprieve from some of the more solemn liturgy is part of this day.

So is our joy in the baptism of Cameron Dwyer Nash, son of Ben and Julie; and our Mission Fair immediately following worship in Dodd Hall. Please linger for a few moments and see how lives are changed because of your financial support of this church and its mission budget.




