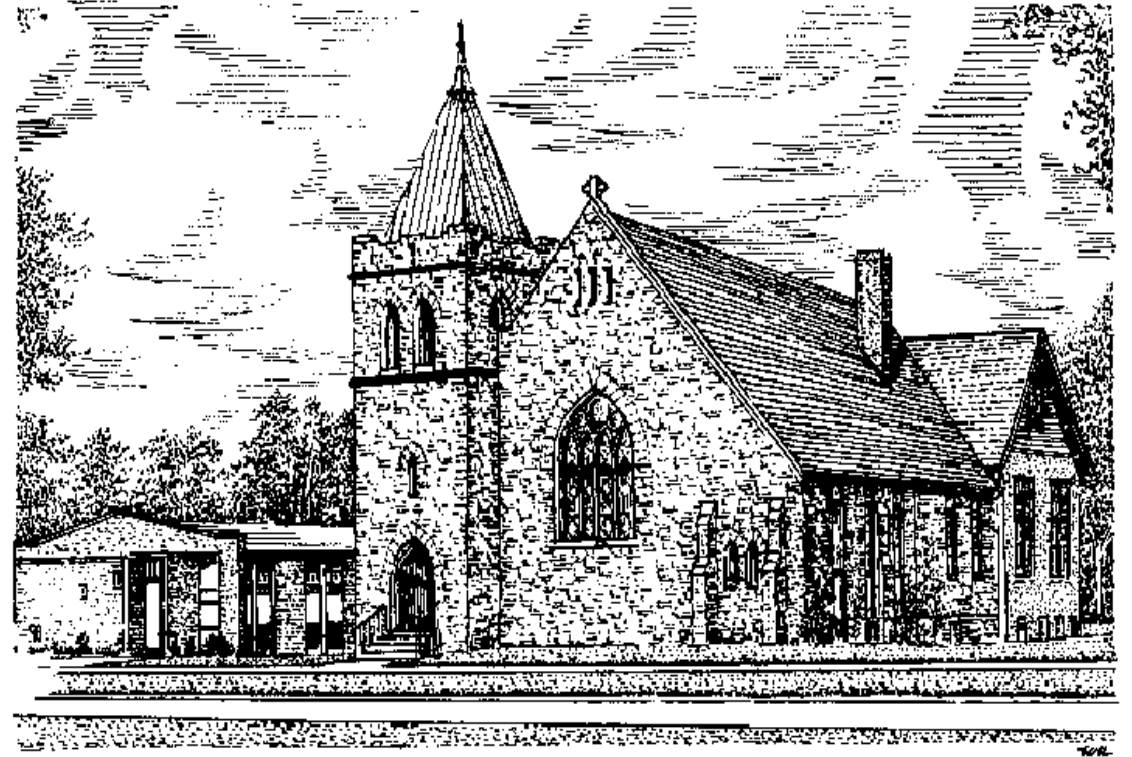

Dear Mary Taylor Memorial Church community,

The Rev. Cynthia (Cindy) Dodd, our preacher today, is a daughter of this church whose bio is on the rear cover of the liturgy. Her roots run deep: Dodd Hall is named after her late parents, John and Katherine Dodd, memorialized on the bronze plaque on the north kitchen wall. Please greet her after worship, especially if you have not yet had the pleasure of meeting her. My thanks to her and Pastor Dani Levine for leading worship today as Carol and I travel in Canada. We return for worship next Sunday.

The Rev. Dodd has also been part of our Healing and Wholeness Ministry and Monday night worship since its inception over ten years ago. Pastor Hal Vink has led this ministry for many years and has decided to retire from this staff position after June 30th. Therefore, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee is pleased to announce that Rev. Dodd will be the staff person responsible for this ministry beginning July 1 with the title "Pastor of Healing Ministry." She will be a leader among leaders in the Monday night, 7 p.m. "Healing and Wholeness" Chapel worship; and recruit and train prayer anointers who serve the last Sunday of each month in 10 a.m. worship. We began a new layout last Sunday for Fellowship Time as instituted by our Membership and Evangelism Ministry. We will serve from the alcove, leaving greater space to mingle in the main portion of Dodd Hall with room to set a few additional tables for those who need seating.

I especially hope you will make an effort to be here on Mother's Day, May 13, when Bishop Bickerton and Dr. Sylvester, our Superintendent, will be with us to celebrate Confirmation.

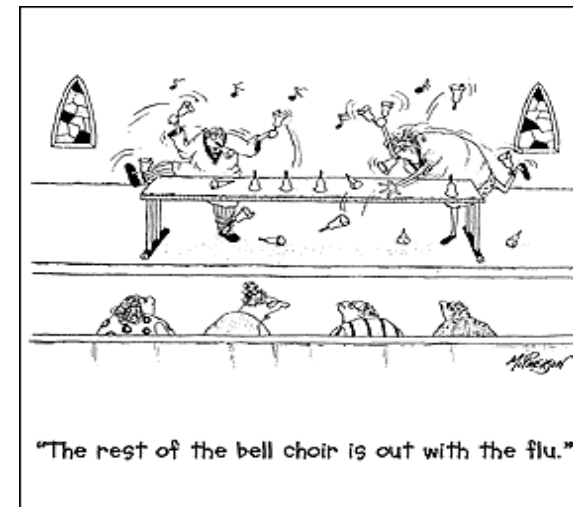
