APRIL 2024 - PASTOR'S COLUMN

Later on that Easter day, on the Road to Emmaus, when two disciples were on their way back home, their hearts were heavy. They were in a dense fog. Perhaps they felt ashamed for abandoning Jesus when he was on the cross. And now, they feel abandoned themselves. But Jesus appears to them on their road of sadness, their road of grief, their road of loneliness, coming as a

radiant light, brightening their world, and causing their hearts to burn within. Jesus illuminates the scriptures to them, letting them remember who he is and what needed to take place, providing a ray of hope in the darkest places of their hearts. On that Road to Emmaus, the travelers encounter the deepest love of God, lifting them to new life, healing their souls, loving them into the resurrection.

As the night wears on, the disciples beg Jesus to stay; they do not want to be abandoned again. Even though their eyes still cannot fully recognize who is speaking to them, their hearts know better. Jesus stays, sharing a meal with them. As he takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the bread, their eyes are opened, and they finally see him. In community, Jesus became known. Where these two were gathered, Jesus came into their midst. In the breaking of the Bread, the One Body of Christ, Jesus became alive in them. In their darkest and saddest time, Jesus came to the disciples as the Light of the World, allowing them to fully see the Risen Christ.

For these disciples, seeing the Risen Christ does not mean they had a full understanding of what this grace meant for them. Theologian John Calvin said, "How we feed on Christ is a mystery too lofty for either my mind to comprehend or my words to declare...I rather experience than understand it." Seeing the Risen Christ may be like that for us, more of an experience than a full understanding. It is a celebration and remembrance of God's grace and mercy in Jesus, of the resurrection of Christ, and of Christ's real and continuing presence with us. Holy Communion is the sacrament that sustains and nourishes us, providing an opportunity to renew the covenant made with God and to be rededicated to service in Christ.

We will have many opportunities to share Holy Communion together in April. On April 7th (First Sunday of the Month), and then again on April 14th, as we remember the disciples encountering Jesus on that road. Please come and experience this Sacred Moment of Grace together, connecting us all as the One Body of Christ. As it was for those disciples encountering Christ after their Walk to Emmaus, so it can be for us. Experience the Grace of the Risen Christ! New Life for all!

From Leigh Bak: These screenings can truly be life saving. In the past, when we have hosted these screenings at Mary Taylor Memorial, I recall two very grateful church members who found that they had life-threatening but treatable medical conditions. One of them had a blocked cerebral artery (which could have led to a stroke) and underwent successful endarterectomy to clear the blockage. The other had an aortic aneurysm that needed to be monitored for progression by their physician. Both were very grateful that we had hosted the event that caught their problem so they could be monitored and treated appropriately.

5 preventive health screenings for these diseases:

Carotid Artery Disease, Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA), Atrial Fibrillation (AFib), Osteoporosis Risk.

155 Years of United Women in Faith (formerly United Methodist Women) Submitted by Becky Virgalla

In March of 1869, eight Methodist women in South Boston met to form the Women's Foreign Missionary Society. These pioneering women voted to send their first missionary to India. They also answered an appeal from missionaries for a medical woman, if such could be found. Shortly thereafter, Miss Isabella Thoburn (1840-1901) and Dr. Clara Swain (1834-1910) sailed from New York to India. Fundraising to send these women to India was not by public collection or through church funds, but by every woman laying aside 2 cents a week or one dollar a year. By 1871, there were 614 auxiliary units and over 26,000 members of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society.

Methodist Women pioneered all aspects of mission service. They were the first medical women medical missionaries in India. They opposed foot binding and female infanticide in China and introduced government legislation to abolish child marriages in India. In Africa, they sheltered girls fleeing forced marriages and rescued abandoned children. Methodist missionary women exposed sex trafficking by infiltrating brothels established in the late 1800s near lumber camps in Wisconsin and in barracks of the British Army.

In the United States, Methodist Women reached out to immigrants in crowded urban slums. They revived the ancient order of deaconesses as women consecrated to work among the poor. Deaconesses visited the poor in their homes, opened kindergartens and settlement houses, and even founded charity hospitals in cities.

The Methodist Women founded the first women's college in Asia, the Isabella Thoburn College in Luknow, India, named after its founder and the first missionary sent there. They also founded the largest women's college in Asia, Ewah Women's University in Korea. Both of these educational institutions still exist today. The Clara Swain Hospital, named after its first female doctor, was founded in the 1870s to provide medical care for women and children. Today, it is one of the oldest and largest Methodist Hospitals in India.

In 1879, on the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society (now known as United Women in Faith), stained glass windows were placed in the back of the sanctuary of the Tremont Street Church in South Boston to honor the eight women who first came together to organize the Society. In the 1940s, windows honoring their first two missionaries, Isabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swain, were also placed in the church.



155 Years of United Women in Faith (formerly United Methodist Women) Continued

Following World War II and the Korean War, United Methodist Women recognized the need for a place to work on behalf of peace. Ideally, it was to be situated near the newly formed United Nations. The only parcel of land available was directly across the street. In 1963, United Methodist Women dedicated their own 13-story building, naming it the Church Center for the United Nations. Decades later, this building still operates as a reminder to its mission of peacemaking. In 1973, United Methodist Women became the Women's Mission Organization of the United Methodist Church.

In 2022, we marked the beginning of a new era as United Women in Faith, We stand ready to not only continue our legacy but to forge courageous new paths.

From just eight women in 1869 Boston to nearly half a million women worldwide today, United Women in Faith continue to work to better the lives of women, youth and children.






